	Ensure that it is <u>quantified</u> . It should have \$ signs in it. Once you get it past the bots, it needs to stand out enough for the recruiter to want you for an interview.

*Sc	oftware Engineers have to do all of the above plus <u>Code Reviews</u> .
**V	Varehouse / Fulfillment jobs have a different process (click <u>here</u> ).
Pr	epare your Resume for <u>EACH</u> Job Posting and Submit Online
	Are you at <u>least 50% qualified</u> ?
	Did you do the <u>copy paste trick</u> ? Or at least, include as many <b>keywords</b> from the job posting's qualifications and skills into the resume. You have to get it past the recruiting algorithm.
W	ell Before Your Interview – Preparation is Everything
	Study my interview tips on my site they are very detailed and cover everything you need to get hired from social stalking the interviewers to tactfully asking for the next steps when you're done with the interview.
	Buy <u>lighting</u> or try to schedule your interview early or make sure you're in a well-lit room next to a window or something. First impressions are everything.
	Re-read and study the <u>Hiring Process</u> , especially the Leadership principles.
	Study the <u>Sample Answers</u> I gave for the Amazon interview questions on my site.
	Search LinkedIn for actual Amazon recruiters and hiring managers to DM them, if you want! Normally, I don't promote this activity but with huge companies like Amazon, you are a needle in the haystack, so you have to stand out.
	Using the job requirements, google search common interview questions, and answer them using this <u>STAR technique interview prep template</u> from Microsoft templates!
	Install their in-house <u>Chime</u> tool and test it out.
	Print your resume and all your notes.

	Buy interview clothes if you need to, but don't forget simple is best. Amazon has guidelines on their interview attire. They even recommend simple, clean attired. I think a plain and simple dress shirt is always the best way to go. This isn't a fashion show! LOL	
1-	2 Hours Before Your Interview – First Impressions

	Find a quiet, well-lit room, and set up your lights and webcam, if possible.	
	If possible, don't use a wireless connection – plug in your laptop directly into your modem so you don't lose internet connection during your interview!	
	Test the <u>Chime</u> tool again – you never know if a software update didn't happen overnight.	
	Spread out your notes, resume, water bottle (so you don't make a lot of sound), pen, and notepad.	
	Put your cell on MUTE – don't forget. 🚱 🕲	
	Close any other programs on your laptop or press F11 to go into Full Screen mode.	
	Call into the conference a few minutes early – DO NOT BE LATE!
